WVYFC GUIDELINES FOR CLUB CHAIRMEN

- 1. The Chairman is responsible to the Club Members for management of the Club and its programme.
- 2. Understand the modern concepts of the Young Farmers' Movement; read what is going on in YFC in the National and County publications.
- 3. Know your Constitution and correct meeting procedure.
- 4. Encourage a good team spirit.
- 5. Use a little humour to relieve tension.
- 6. Welcome new members by speaking to them personally and by ensuring someone will look after them until they become established. Speak to them as subsequent meetings.
- 7. Welcome and give a good introduction to speakers and see they are adequately thanked.
- 8. Maintain control firmly but be courteous at all times to all people.
- 9. Use your vote and casting vote sparingly and wisely.
- 10. Always maintain an impartial outlook.
- 11. Always be punctual with meetings and be a good ambassador for your Club at other meetings.
- 12. Help future officers to learn the necessary skills.
- 13. While not "making a meal" of formality, use correct committee procedures so that the Club is an example to members on how to make collective discussions. Keep discussions relevant.
- 14. Ensure that every meeting has an agenda which has been thought out and prepared. Ensure you know what you want to achieve.
- 15. Use group discussions to gather all your Club Members' ideas for the Club Programme. It is not the job of the Club Officers to decide the programme.
- 16. Remember your Club is part of the local community.
- 17. Contact the county Youth Service; they can help your Club.
- 18. Set a personal example to Club members.
- 19. When in doubt consult the Club Leader or County Organiser.
